The Gospel of Matthew

Matthew Class Synopsis:

The story of Jesus is told in four Gospels. Each writer has a special purpose for the way they organize the stories and messages from Jesus' life. Matthew uses a powerful, systematic, step by step approach to proving the Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God. If you are someone who likes to learn and teach in steps, this Gospel will appeal to you. Step 1: Genealogies prove Jesus. Step 2: Prophecy proves Jesus. And so forth. Once you get to the empty tomb in chapter 28, there is absolutely no doubt to the honest heart that Christ is King and we must serve and honor Him entirely.

The first nine chapters seem to be a methodical approach to proving Jesus. Once Matthew picks up the narrative in chapter 10 there are many reasons to follow closely everything the Messiah says and does.

Matthew's Gospel was written in about 60 A.D. to a Jewish audience. There were many Jewish Christians, but millions of Jews were not, rejecting Christianity. But 70 A.D. was fast approaching (the destruction of the temple and annihilation of one million Jews). Matthew is trying to convince them to believe in Jesus, trust Jesus, and follow His will today!

Proving Jesus to a Jewish Audience:

- 1) Jesus connected to Patriarchs
- 2) Jesus supported by the Holy Spirit
- 3) Jesus observed in Prophecy
- 4) Jesus honored by John the Baptist
- 5) Jesus proved His Awesomeness

5) Be Loyal	6:19-34	In loyal, worry free, commitment to Christ
6) Be Fair	7:1-6	Looking first within, then seeking to help others
7) Be Diligent	7:7-12	Ever diligently praying and pursuing God's way
8) Be Obedient	7:13-29	Acting on what we hear, bearing good fruit

Chapter 21 – Jesus enters Jerusalem as the Prophets Wrote

<u>Event:</u> <u>Prophecy:</u>

Enters Jerusalem on a colt Isaiah 62:11; Zech. 9:9

Drives greedy men out of the Temple Isaiah 56:7; Jer. 7:11

Proves the hard hearts of the Pharisees Psalm 118:22

Chapter 22: Jesus contends with the Pharisees and Sadducees in Jerusalem

(v1-14) - He begins with a parable that indicts the Jewish leaders for their hard hearts

The Jews ask 3 Questions: Jesus asks 3 Questions

- 1) Is it lawful to give tax to Caesar? (v17) 1) Whose son is the Christ? (v42)
- 2) Who is married to whom in heaven? (v28) 2) How does David call Him Lord? (v44)
- 3) What is the greatest commandment? (v36) 3) How is He David's Son? (v45)

Jesus answers powerfully each time.

The Jews had no answer!

Chapter 23 – Jesus exposes the Hypocrisy of the Pharisees

Common Attributes of Hypocrisy (v1-7)

- 1) The teaching is accurate.
- 2) The application is for others.
- 3) The purpose is self-promoting.

Jesus' strong words against the Pharisees

- 1) "Woe to you" (mentioned 8 times)
- 2) "hypocrites" (mentioned 3 times)
- 3) "blind" (mentioned 3 times)
