

Introduction: Quote: **“Isn’t it a comfort to worship a God we cannot exaggerate?”** Francis Chan

Matthew 6:25-30 – God is almighty. God made us all and all things. God made the sun and placed it 93million miles away. God looks at for all things, and causes things to be born and to die, in His time. Do we not have the faith to know He is in and over our lives?

TWO SONGS – Songs about His glory, His might, His power

Sometimes it is difficult times, times of trial or loss, that cause us to question God. But how can we ever question the power of an almighty God? Don’t we know who He is? Don’t we understand His Glory?

Job 1:20-22 – After incredible loss and pain, Job got to a place that might resemble our own – he did not blame or abandon God. He continued to worship. He did not sin. But he did become upset, angry and had very heavy questions:

- 1) **Job 3:11** – “wherefore was I born?”
- 2) **Job 9:2** – “How can a man be just with God?”
- 3) **Job 14:14** – “If a man dies shall he live again?”

He wanted his moment to appear before God to get answers. We can be like that sometimes. We aren’t giving up on God but we don’t understand. We want answers. *Why am I here? Why is this happening? Can I be right with God? Will He bless me? Is this going somewhere eternal? Will I be saved?*

God responds: **Job 38, 39:1-4,19-30; 41:1-21** – WOW! We are nothing and He is everything. He is power beyond our imagination. He made us and holds this all together. He is glorious.

TWO SONGS - More Songs about His glory, might, power

Job has his answers. No, not direct explanations from God. Instead He is shown that height and magnitude of God, and the answer is: I AM MIGHT. TRUST ME.

Job 40:1-9; 42:1-6 – Job sees the distance between himself and God. Now it isn’t: “why would God do this to me?” Now it is: “I can’t believe a God like this would even consider me. I repent of every questioning you. I will serve you.”

Job 40:10 – That was the TRUST that God told Satan Job would manifest. And he did. And God blessed Him. God proved what Job knew in the beginning: **Job 1:20-22**
No matter what, whether He give or take away... in all those things we say: Blessed be His Name!

God doesn’t promise you answers. God doesn’t promise explanations. God promises that He is great enough to work all to spiritual good. And that if you complete give yourself to Him, He will bless you, keep you, consider you.
